Headteacher's News

The next few weeks promise to be busy ones with lots going on. The term will end with a **poetry recital** on **Wednesday 19th & Thursday 20th December** with Years 1-3 on the Wednesday from 9am, and Year 4-6 on the final day at the same time. Each class, rather like in the summer term, will recite a poem in unison, some seasonal and some not, and parents are of course very welcome to attend. All the children are studying poetry for the last fortnight of the term and their performances in the recitals will help to bring the curtain down on the autumn term with great aplomb.

We are still finding that many **children's uniform** items and bags are not being labelled correctly – please ensure that first and last names *and class* are written clearly on labels so that lost items can be swiftly returned to owners. Our older children are often happy to do this redistributing but as things stand it is proving difficult to do.

At the end of the day and in snatched minutes between lessons, some delightful and very melodic sounds are to be heard emanating from Reception and Year 1 classes, as they begin to practise their songs for the **nativity** on 17th and 18th December at the church. It will be a lovely event and our younger ones are very excited about performing.

I'd like to inform parents that there is a **new statutory assessment** on the way and its heading for Year 4! In 2020, all Year 4 pupils in England will sit a times-tables test that will assess their speed in recalling their times-table facts up to the 12-times table. In 2019, schools have been invited to be part in the 'pilot' for the new assessment and St Mary's has asked to be one of these schools. We have long expected the children to know their times-tables so the challenge of learning them by the end of Year 4 will not be a new one, but this is the first time that there has been a national assessment will be conducted we will let you know. One innovation we have put into place this year has been the use of a fun online program called 'T-T Rock Stars' which is proving very popular with the children and further improving their recall of multiplication facts; in this way we will continue to find engaging ways to further improve the children's number fluency.

Lots of families contributed to the **Shoe-Box Appeal** recently as you can see from the photo over the page. As an alternative for those that would prefer a different type of seasonal act of charity, we are accepting donations to the local *'Eat or Heat' Walthamstow Foodbank* which helps local people who are finding it difficult to make ends meet. We will send the food that we have had donated to the FoodBank on Monday 17th Dec, so if you would like to contribute please send the food either yourself or via your child to the school office. Non-perishable food only please.

Whole School Attendance and Punctuality

The whole school attendance target is **96.5%**. Each week we will advise you of the percentage we achieved. Last week, we achieved **92.2%** which is below our target figure. From September until last Friday, the whole school attendance is **96.6%** which meets our target, and there have been 463 late marks.
