# Whole School Attendance and punctuality.

The whole school attendance target is 96.5%. Last week our attendance fell slightly below that target at 96.32% but from 6th September 2017 remains above the target at 97.04%. There have been 525 late marks to date.

Attendance and Punctuality No class managed 100% attendance last week, but well done to 3M who had the best attendance with 99.63%. Punctuality was good with children in 5A, 4M, 1W, 1A and RW on time every day! There were 54 late marks across the school for the week.

# **Please help our start of day** We now have close to 650 children attending St Mary's every day – and you will have seen that it's quite a job getting them all into school!

Please could we ask parents/ carers to help us in three ways: • Say goodbye to your children before their line heads into school – this will help us to keep class lines together and avoid the problem of class lines crossing over into each other.

• When leaving via either Chestnut Avenue gate, please try to exit by reaching the gates behind the lines as they move towards school, rather than walking through them.

• If you are able leave via either playground gate rather than the very tight passageway to Brooke Road, that would be hugely helpful.

• Please remember that teachers need to get pupils in to start the day promptly. If you could minimise messages in the morning – perhaps pass a note to the teacher or arrange a meeting at the end of the day – that would also help our logistics massively. At the end of the day, teachers are much more able to talk. However, please do not feel that you cannot pass on important messages.
