I hope you had a restful Christmas holiday and new year and welcome you back to another term at St. Mary's. School Meals

As mentioned above we will be changing our school meals catering provider with effect from 3rd February. We will no longer be catered for by Aspens and instead by our new providers, called The Pantry. You will be receiving further information directly from the new company shortly, but we wanted to make you aware that all lunch money arrears will need to be cleared by Monday 27th January. Any child who still has arrears on their account by Monday 3rd February will need to bring a packed lunch to school as we will not be able to provide a meal with the new provider if there are arrears showing on your account. Thank you.

Parents are invited to join together and meet for a coffee every Monday, starting at 8.40am and ending at 9.00am. If you would like to join us, coffee will be served in the gym. Some parents may then like to stay at 9.00am to watch the Y1-3 gym assembly or Y4-6 hall one, both of which end at 9.25am.

Friday Assembly

This term, Attlee Houses will have their Friday assembly in the school hall and Wilson and Morris Houses will be in the gym. This is a change to the arrangement for last term.

Science Symposium

We are very excited about our forthcoming Science Symposium which will take place after school on Friday 31st January and hope that children are working on their science project at home. These projects will then be displayed on the day of the event and will be judged by a team of scientists. Winners will receive amazing scientific prizes! This competition was announced to the children before Christmas and a letter with instructions was sent home. A further copy of that letter has been sent home today as a reminder. The deadline for the project is Tuesday 28th January 2020. To display their project, we encourage you to take pictures of each step.



Please note – there will be NO AFTER SCHOOL ACTIVITY CLUBS on Friday 31st due to the Symposium. Tea Time Club however continues as usual.

Finance Matters

Please could we ask that you take a look at your ParentPay account and pay any outstanding balances. If you have still not paid for your child's Panto (£2.50 for Infants and £20 for Juniors) or for your child's book deposit (£10 for years 3 to 6), please could you clear those items if at all possible. For those parents who prefer to pay for school lunches on a half termly basis, the amount due up to February half term would be £63.80.

School Uniform

We always have a large amount of lost property in school and where possible we always try to reunite items with their owners. However, most of the items are un-named, which makes it impossible to do this. Please could you ensure that every item of clothing, including coats, are <u>labelled with your child's</u> <u>forename and surname, and class</u> – at the moment a high % of uniform is not.

Parental Communication

We have just recently started to utilise a text messaging service, and will use it to send out any head-bump or general messages to the school community. Messages are limited to 160 characters so may often be short and sweet! You will still continue to receive messages, letters, newsletters via ParentMail. Please remember that it is very important that you keep us updated as to changes in phone numbers and email addresses etc.

Reception Intake September 2020

Children born between 1 September 2015 and 31 August 2016 will need to apply this year by TOMORROW - 15th January 2020 for admission in September 2020. Application must be made to the to the Borough AND by submitting one of our own supplementary application forms. Any applications received by Waltham Forest after this date will be considered as LATE applications and will not be considered until all places have been allocated to children who applied on time. If you already have a child at St Mary's, you still need to apply – places are not automatically offered.

Whole School Attendance

The whole school attendance target is 96.5% and last week for our first week back we were below that mark at 95.4%. There were no classes who achieved 100% attendance, but 3M had the best attendance with 99.5%. No classes had perfect punctuality last week but 3 Wilson had the best punctuality record with just one late mark each. Attendance overall this year has been **96.1%**.

Parent Workshops

During the course of the year we will be running a series of Parent Workshops on a number of subjects that parents may find useful. The workshop will begin at 3.45 and will last between 30 minutes and an hour. There will be a crèche for your child, should you wish to attend.
