I will be present in the playground at the start and end of most school days and will also be holding some more coffee mornings for parents wishing to meet me. Thank you for your welcome so far, and I wish you a very happy and successful 2018.

# Whole School Attendance and punctuality.

The whole school attendance target is 96.5%. Last week, our first week back, attendance fell slightly below that target at 94.83% but from 6th September 2017 remains above the target at 96.84%. There have been 699 late marks to date.
