Y2A Agents of Change Project

Y2A children visited a Food Bank in Tottenham, where they met Dean Wigzell, the project leader and Jade Ayoola of Freedom's Ark Church. This particular food bank, run by the Trussell Trust in Tottenham Town Hall, was set up two months ago. There are now more food banks across the UK than branches of Macdonalds.



Dean, the Project Leader, told our Y2 children: "One of the most important things for humans is food and a food bank is for people who cannot afford food perhaps because they have big bills to pay. Lots of people really need this help - especially at Christmas." Dean also explained that people who need to use the food bank need to get a special letter of referral from the CAB, their children's school, their doctor or a church.

The Food Bank team answered various questions from our Y2 children including how they stop food going mouldy! They also found out that food bank volunteers make sure they give out foods that are closest to their use by dates. The children also learned that the favourite cereal of people who use this particular food bank is Weetabix and the favourite pasta is penne! When she found out it was the children's idea to donate to the food bank, Jade said: "It is super-important that you guys thought to do this - it shows how thoughtful and aware you are what is going on in London."
