Head's Message

If you cast your mind back to last summer, you may recall reading about a proposed Library Bus that would be situated in the playground near to where the table-tennis tables are now. A few months on, we are further down the road (to keep up the travel theme) and are close to having the double-decker in position ready for its refurbishment. A quick internet search using the words Primary School Library Bus will give you a flavour of what the bus might look like when adapted for its new purpose. We expect the bus to be a wonderful and inspiring resource, one that the children are excited about visiting either in class visits or casually at break and lunchtimes (where it will offer solace from the hustle and bustle of the playground).

In the next few days you will receive a letter about our plans to raise funds for the refurbishment of the bus. The children will be undertaking a run, challenging themselves to go a distance that they will then collect sponsors for. I know of a school that ran a very similar campaign raising £7,000 in total so we are hopeful that, in our large 3-form entry school, we can raise most of what we need for the bus via this sponsored run. As well as raising funds we will of course be encouraging the children to be physically active, to set goals for themselves, and to have fun! You could add to the special event by coming along on the day of the sponsored run to participate with your child. This week we will talk to the children in assemblies about the run

and look forward to seeing the whole school community get behind the project.

Great News

Parents may have seen the following article in one of the local newspapers. We are delighted at the great news!

<u>"London school awarded</u> <u>£96,500 from prestigious</u> <u>national funding award to</u> <u>improve children's reading</u>

An Outstanding primary school in Walthamstow has won £95,600 of funding from the Department for Education to improve children's attainment in London and the East of England.

St Mary's Teaching School received news this week that it was one of only a handful in London and 72 in England to be successful in a bid for the Department for Education's 'Strategic School Improvement Fund' (SSIF). This comes hot on the heels of the designation in the summer of St Mary's CofE Primary - in Brooke Road, Walthamstow – as a Teaching School, National Support School. The school's Chief Executive Officer, Beverley Hall, was also named as a National Leader of Education.

St Mary's was also graded as Outstanding by Ofsted in April 2016.

The school's 'Read Right Project' is aimed to increase children's attainment in reading by developing children's love of reading in schools as widespread as London, Cambridgeshire, Essex and Norfolk. The project will be driven by educational research, involve teacher training and see children taught in small group interventions. St Mary's is also inviting schools in North East London and the East of England to contact the school if they require, or would like to enquire about, support.

"We're delighted to have been successful in this important bid," said Beverley Hall, who created the bid with St Mary's Nursery Principal, Leann Valiquette. "It's fantastic that the funding will help us to further develop the success we have had in teaching the higher skills of reading comprehension at St Mary's and to roll this out to other schools and children in Waltham Forest and beyond.

In 2017, St Mary's children topped the government's School Performance Tables for Waltham Forest for those achieving at a higher standard in reading, writing and maths, with 40% achieving this key measure. This compared to a national average of 9% and a Waltham Forest average of 11%."

Punctuality across the school was significantly improved last week, with late marks cut in half from the previous week with 37. Thank you to those who have made a conscious effort to be on time more regularly. This huge improvement meant that RA, IM, IW, 2A, 2W, 3M and 6A all had zero late marks, which is great. Well done to all those classes. 3A had the best attendance, with an almost perfect 99.26%.

Whole School Attendance and punctuality

The whole school attendance target is 96.5%. Last week, attendance fell just short of our target at 96.21% and from 6th September 2017 remains above the target at 96.81%. There have been 939 late marks from the beginning of this academic year to date.
