Headteacher's News

This week **parent/teacher conferences** take place and I hope that all parents have taken the opportunity to meet with their child's teacher to discuss their ongoing progress. The teachers will be able to share the children's various exercise books with parents as well as giving information about targets and areas for development for the spring and summer term. In some recent parent/teacher conferences some timings have over-run and sometimes this has caused significant delays in parents meeting their child's teacher, so we will be endeavouring to keep to the 10-minute window for all appointments this week in order that everyone is seen on time.

Next week on Friday after school, St Mary's first **Science Symposium** takes place. This will be a real treat and I advise all parents to try to attend if at all possible. A range of scientific activities will be available for children to interact with courtesy of Empiribox and the school staff, who will all be in attendance. For more information, read overleaf.

Finally, every now again we like to remind all of our parents that all schools have a duty to safeguard children and to pass on information to relevant agencies where we feel that it is necessary and in the best interests of the child. Following this sharing of information, we work very closely with relevant agencies in terms of how we respond to cases, as all schools are required to do. We tend to err on the side of caution when processing safeguarding information and refer on any concerns that *might* potentially affect the wellbeing of a child so that the concerns can be looked into by the relevant agencies. This is the approach of most schools and one that we also take in order to ensure the safety of the children.

Any child who still has arrears on their account by Monday 3rd February will need to bring a packed lunch to school as we will not be able to provide a meal with the new provider if there are arrears showing on your account.
