Head's Message

Over the last few weeks, we have had lots of parents joining us during the course of the day for various events: daily 'Challenge' sessions in Reception classes; a dyslexia workshop for parents of SEN pupils; Parent Open Days before half-term; parent & child sponsored runs in the playground last week; and Class/Friday assemblies, which continue to be very well supported. The recent after-school subject-specific workshops that we have run have been a little less busy by Last week staff held a comparison. maths workshop for parents and some parents came and found it very helpful, but we would like some feedback on how we can raise attendance at these types of workshops and how we can put on these events in such a way that meets the wishes of parents. We would be willing to look at the timing and location of the workshops to see if they could be adjusted to better fit around parents' busy schedules. On a different note, our attendance figures are not as high as we would like at present; this is due to various reasons, including the snow of a few days ago. One thing that we would like to reduce is the number of children that need to be sent home once they are in school. Children often forget about their headache/tummy ache/sore throat once they are in school with their friends, but we are finding with a small number of families, the child's condition is being discussed at such length in the morning with the classteacher (in the presence of the child) that the child is then unduly influenced by that overheard conversation and more likely to say they feel unwell later in the day. If your child is not feeling 100% do please feel free to let us know, but please do so in a subtle manner so the child gets their 'School Head' and casts their on minor sniffles/cough to one side and gets on with the day. Of course, during the course of the day, if the staff think that a child is unwell, they will make sure that a call is made home to alert the parent – if this decision is left to the staff to make then we can be more sure that the child's illness merits them going home. Attendance and Punctuality

Punctuality was slightly better last week, but only just, with 56 late marks! There are still too many children arriving late – very often just by five minutes or so. Whole School Attendance and punctuality

The whole school attendance target is 96.5%. Attendance improved last week but we are still short of our target at 95.6%.

From September 2017 to last week, attendance remains just short of that target at 96.2%. There have been 1189 late marks from the beginning of this academic year to date.
