Last week at St Mary's, we were privileged to host a curate from the local diocese of Chelmsford, **Fr Lee Taylor**. It was a pleasure to welcome him to our school, and we wish him well for the future. Before leaving, Fr Lee shared his thoughts with us following his 4-day visit...

*"It's always a nerve-racking experience going to a new school for the first time; and no less so than when you're a trainee Priest (Curate) on a four day placement as part of your training. The Diocese of Chelmsford has, for some years, sent second year Curates to spend time working alongside staff, to experience daily life in a school and to give an understanding of the concerns, challenges and opportunities that face teachers, children and other staff. I was fortunate enough to be allocated to St Mary's and I needn't have had any nerves as the welcome I was given by both staff and pupils was very generous.*

*Spending time in the classroom I was privileged to watch the interactions with teachers and children, to see how the children were given the confidence to approach fresh problems either in maths or literacy or other subjects. And it was a joy to watch children and teachers alike celebrate when new learning was achieved or existing learning cemented, even getting a refresher on fractions myself! The children's inquisitiveness and openness in the playground, in assembly and at lunch time was refreshing, though some of their questions quite challenging, my favourite being, "Why do you HAVE to be a Priest?"*

*So, thank you to everyone who made my week such a great experience. I have come away with an admiration for both staff and students at the dedication that they put into their work in the fast pace that education operates at. But I've also learnt how a school's values are not just words on posters, but the attitudes that underpin how staff and pupils interact in a school that makes a difference".*

### Parents/carers entering school unattended following after school clubs

Please note that, due to **safeguarding requirements**, we are not able to admit parents/carers to enter the school unsupervised.
