Head's Message

This week has seen the various yeargroups attend St Mary's church to celebrate Pentecost which recalls the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles; an event that the children recreated in church, making the sound of wind as the holy spirit was said to have made as it revealed itself to Jesus' followers. Children held and flapped 'tongues of fire' and a number of children who speak a range of different languages all spoke at the front of the church simultaneously, just as the apostles did spontaneously when the Holy Spirit descended. The Holy Spirit makes up the third part of the trinity, an essential aspect of the Christian faith that our children study in RE lessons. Throughout the service, the children sang songs of a very uplifting nature - it was a pleasant and very reflective end to the term's collective worship, and very engagingly led by our local clergy.

On the subject of community events, we have had a number of very successful class assemblies in recent weeks and it has been lovely to see the children getting the chance to teach the other children, and their parents, a thing or two about their recent endeavours; last week, for example, Y5-Morris took us on a very entertaining tour of the galaxy!
