





Headteacher's Message

Next week at St Mary's will be 'Healthy Living' Week, with the children focussing on what it means to lead a healthy lifestyle. The children will participate in lessons that re-enforce messages that are in-keeping with our recognised 'Healthy Schools' status. Amongst other things, the children will be researching where different vitamins and minerals come from; creating exercise plans; making fruit salads; designing lunch menus and preparing and delivering presentations about staying healthy to younger yeargroups. The children will do more 'Walks to Haiti' in the playground and in PE lessons will begin to prepare for the upcoming sports day at the cricket ground.

Continuing the healthy living theme, I'd just like to remind parents that at breaktimes, only healthy items (preferably fruit) should be consumed as a snack; so this obviously excludes crisps or chocolates/biscuits. Most of the children are abiding by this, but we have seen some recent examples of very sugary snacks being brought in and which are not in the spirit of our general drive to encourage health eating habits. Similarly, children should only have water to drink during the day, with no fizzy drinks.

Finally, I'd like to let parents know that Years 2, 3, 4, 5 & 6 will be receiving Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) lessons later in the term, about which there will be a letter issued to parents very soon. The RSE sessions build very much from the position of relationships and friendships first, which we feel is in sympathy with a Christian standpoint. We will be using a widely taught scheme of work which has been approved by the Walthamstow Standing Advisory Committee on Religious Education and our own governing body. Parent workshops will also be on offer in the coming weeks to provide the opportunity for materials to be viewed that will be used in the lessons.
