

The **Soft Start** began well this morning with children arriving between 8.40am and 8.55am and entering the school independently using the two entrances. Children in classes were making a calm start to the day as they entered the classroom one by one. Tomorrow, Reception classes join in the Soft Start.

As it was **World Mental Health Day** last week, we took the opportunity to talk to children and help raise awareness of something that is often not spoken about but affects so many. In KS1, children discussed the different emotions that they know, how some emotions are similar and how we can look at our friends' faces to get clues about how they may be feeling. We spoke about those 'trusted adults' who can help us and how they might do this if we are feeling unhappy. In KS2, children explored how actions impact on our own and other people's emotions. They discussed how relationships are important and listed actions that contribute to positive relationships and the opposite. In addition to this, they discussed how behaviours can change when a person has a mental illness. The children across the school were clear – it is GOOD to talk about how we are feeling! It was wonderful to hear children engaging in high level conversations about emotional intelligence - a clear step in the right direction to help dispel the stigma that can be attached to mental health illnesse.
