Whilst at the gallery, they took part in two workshops: one included a tour, identifying patterns in William Morris' work and creating similar sketches; the other, a practical exercise where we got to use tools very similar to William Morris himself to create their own repeated pattern designs. All in all, it was an engaging, practical and informative trip, and the children left inspired and excited to continue their Art topic.

This week our wonderful year two and three children are leading the Harvest Services at church. A very special mention to Miss Hanley who has shown her lyrical flare creating her very own songs for the children to perform as well as teach all of year 3 the most incredible rap. All children and staff in year 2 and 3 have worked incredibly hard and we applaud you!
