Headteacher's News

This week is **Anti-Bullying Week** and with that being the case, we will have assemblies on this theme reminding the children of how to handle situations where other children are being unkind whether in person or on the internet. Issues around body image have been an increasingly unhealthy problem in recent times in society at large and schools are affected in turn. We'll be encouraging the children to feel confident about their various body shapes and to accept that difference is something we celebrate at St Mary's, in all its forms. To commemorate Anti-Bullying Week we will be launching the 'Second Adult' approach at St Mary's this week. The idea behind this is to allow children a second opportunity to report a problem that the first adult may not have been able to resolve. This provides a safety net for a child who may want to get additional assistance in stopping unwarranted and negative attention; the child announces to a member of staff, 'You're my Second Adult' and the staff member then revisits the situation.

Yesterday in assembly the children spent a **minute reflecting** on the lost lives of service men and women since the First World War. The children considered the practice of wearing poppies and observed the minute's silence very respectfully.

The new **Y3-6 school choir** and the new **school orchestra** are due to launch within days and I look forward to them performing very soon. The choir will be performing at Wembley Arena in the spring but will also find the time to entertain audiences in the near future, including at the upcoming Black History Month event and at Christmas. Musicians keen to be part of our orchestra have been invited to request a place, and there are one or two left so please register your child's interest if you have a budding instrumentalist in the family.
