## Headteacher's News

This end of summer term is a natural time for any school to self evaluate and to look to make refinements to its practice ahead of the new school year. We are currently looking at all aspects of our curriculum and exploring some exciting new ventures. We are investing in a class set of virtual reality headsets so that geography and history units come alive: children will walk through temples and sail down rivers using this new technology. We are also looking to make better and more frequent use of the great outdoors, and so are planning for all year groups to spend time learning outside the classroom in a Forest School style of project. In literacy, we are appraising the quality of the texts we use, and making some adjustments so that the range of quality books studied is even more diverse and we are also introducing more poetry and non-fiction texts which will link with the revised history/geography/art/DT topics being studied at various points of the year. In maths, we are looking to bolster the curriculum with a greater focus on reasoning and problemsolving, especially in the older classes. Our experiment with giving the junior classes 'immersive' days of French, music and science each 3 weeks (with whole mornings dedicated to each subject on a 3-week rotation) has worked well this year, and will be continued next year.

As the weather improves, we'll be having a number of **outdoor whole school assemblies**, the first of which took place this morning. Next Monday's assembly with our curate, Adam, will be outside and parents will be welcome to join us as always.

Finally, we have had some complaints from our neighbours about our parents **parking** in front of their driveways. Could I, once again, appeal to our parents to park responsibly when driving their children to school.

## Clean Air Day - 2019

This Thursday is Clean Air Day and to mark this we are going to get out into the open air early on Thursday morning with an optional early morning run around the playground. The gates will open early on Thursday at **8.30am** (they usually open later at 8.40am) and parents and children will be invited to run circuits of the playground together to shake off the morning cobwebs. Runners will receive a running sticker at the end of the run at 8.40am and children will then go to their lines as normal for the start of the official school day. Please ensure that your children are attended to as normal throughout this run and do please join in with your child!

Space dome is coming this week on Thursday and Friday!


Science Dome is a school based workshop designed to explore science, geography and geology in a fun and interactive way!
