This is the last newsletter of the year before we head into a new decade. Given the number of sniffles and coughs around the school at the moment, from both children and staff, the holiday is coming at a good time. We have had some fantastic events this week to send us off to the break in style: two **poetry recitals** entertained us all yesterday with classes reciting diverse poems from narrative to metaphorical, and comic to seasonal; three YRec and Y1 **nativities** drew great applause at the church; and the **Christmas carols** event on Wednesday in the hall demonstrated what incredibly talented and confident children we are fortunate to have at St Mary's.

Finance Matters

Please could we ask that you take some time over this Christmas break to have a look at your ParentPay account and pay any outstanding balances. If you have still not paid for your child's Panto (£2.50 for Infants and £20 for Juniors, or for your child's book deposit (£10 for years 3 to 6), please could you clear those items if at all possible. For those parents who prefer to pay for school lunches on a half termly basis, the amount due up to February half term would be £63.80.

School Uniform

We always have a large amount of lost property in school and where possible we always try to reunite items with their owners. However, most of the items are un-named, which makes it impossible to do this. Please could you ensure that every item of clothing, including coats, are labelled with your child's name and class.

Parental Communication

We have just recently started to utilise a text messaging service, and will use it to send out any head-bump or general messages to the school community. Messages are limited to 160 characters so may often be short and sweet! You will still continue to receive messages, letters, newsletters etc via ParentMail. Please remember that it is very important that you keep us updated as to changes in phone numbers, e mail addresses etc.

Reception Intake September 2020

Children born between 1 September 2015 and 31 August 2016 will need to apply this year by 15th January 2020 for admission in September 2020. We just one Open Evening remaining on Monday 13th January at 10am. Please share with any interested parties. Application must be made to the to the Borough AND by submitting one of our own supplementary application forms.

Attendance Certificates

We usually present attendance certificates at the end of the summer term. The criteria is that children need to have 100% attendance and no late marks. A whole year is quite a big achievement so to encourage good attendance and punctuality, we will be presenting certificates on a termly basis. 87 children have been presented with this award this term.
