Dinner Money

Just a quick reminder, school meals are now £2.16 per day, which is £10.80 per week. For those parents who prefer to pay half termly, the cost of dinner money from 3 | st October to 21st December inclusive will be £82.08. Payment may be made on ParentPay at any time and accounts should be kept in credit at all times.

Finance Matters

All payments to school must be made via ParentPay.

Please note that breakfast and tea time clubs must be kept in credit at all times. We have a waiting list for both these clubs so failure to keep your account in credit may lead to your child being removed from the club and their space offered to another child.

Our late collection policy for Tea Time Club is also being 5 minutes late enforced. collection incurs a £5 fine. Every five minutes or part thereof after will incur an additional £5. This fine will be added to your ParentPay account.

Similarly, dinner money accounts should be kept up to date. Failure to do so could mean that you are asked to provide a packed lunch until your child's account is back in credit.

SHINE and Achievement School

If your child attends SHINE and you have not yet been able to pay the £15 due for this term, please could you do so via ParentPay as soon as possible. SHINE begins again after our half term break on Saturday 5th November at Stoneydown, where it will continue on the following dates: 12^{th} , 19^{th} and 26^{th} November

3rd and 10th December.

After the Christmas holiday, the venue will change to St Mary's, commencing on Saturday 7th January.

Achievement School for Year 6 pupils will start here at St Mary's after the half term, on 5^{th} November and will run on 12^{th} , 19^{th} and 26^{th} November, and 3^{rd} and 10^{th} December.

Class Corner

Year 6 Attlee have had a super first half term! For some children, the transition from Year 5 to Year 6 can be quite daunting, ut 6A have impressed me with their determination and positivity. We have been focusing on WW2 for both our topic and literacy lessons, and we have all been enjoying the focus text, Goodnight Mr. Tom. In our maths lessons over the past 6 weeks, we have been focusing on place value (whole numbers and decimals) long division more recently, and multiplying fractions. In addition, the children have been exploring the unit 'Light' in their science lessons. We are all looking forward to an exciting year in Year 6!

Whole School Attendance

The whole school attendance target is 96.5%. For the week before half term, we achieved 97.27%

Attendance Winner

Well done to I Wilson who had the best punctuality of the week before half term, with an almost perfect 99.58%. Well done.

Punctuality Awards

Well done to Reception Attlee who had everyone here on time every single day in the week before half term.

Punctuality across the rest of the school did improve but could still be better. There were 61 late marks in total.

For the first half of the autumn term, overall attendance reached 97.65% and the number of late marks was 381.

Being punctual is a good life lesson and good habits formed when young will stay with us forever.

Punctuality is so important for your child's education. Don't forget, 5 minutes late each day = 3 days lost!

10 minutes late = 6 days lost!

15 minutes late = 9 days lost!

20 minutes late = 12 days lost!, and 30 minutes late = 18 days lost!

We know that every minute counts so please try to get here on time every day!
