## **School Uniform**

Everyone has returned to school looking extremely smart.

We no longer stock items of school uniform. All uniform and school bags can be ordered on line via our School website or from the Victoria 2 school uniform shop on Hoe Street. With regard to school bags, please remember that children should bring school book bags ONLY – no rucksacks or other bags please. Also, as requested, please remove all keyrings etc from bag handles as we just do not have the room to store anything other than the book bag itself. Thank you.

May we remind you that no jewellery should be worn except for a small pair of stud earrings and a watch. Nail varnish should not be worn to school.

Just incase you need a reminder, here is a list of our school uniform:

#### Boys

Grey trousers or shorts White shirt or Polo Maroon sweatshirt or cardigan Plain grey/black or white socks Black shoes or plain black/white Trainers no logos.

#### Girls

Grey trousers, shorts, skirt or pinafore White blouse or Polo Maroon sweatshirt or cardigan Plain grey/black or white socks or tights but not Leggings. Black low heeled shoes or plain black or white trainers no logos Schools style pink check dresses In the summer with sensible sandals.

#### **Punctuality Winner**

We will also let you know each week the class achieving the best punctuality. They will receive the punctuality bear to keep in class for the week.

#### **Dinner Money**

Just a quick reminder, school meals are now £2.16 per day, which is £10.80 per week. For those parents who prefer to pay half termly, the cost of dinner money for this half term will be £69.12. Payment may be made on ParentPay at any time and accounts should be kept in credit at all times.

#### **Finance Matters**

All payments to school must be made via ParentPay. Reception parents will be issued with an activation letter in due course. Items such as trips, music lessons etc will be added as appropriate. Please note that breakfast and tea time clubs must be kept in credit at all times. We have a waiting list for both these clubs so failure to keep your account in credit may lead to your child being removed from the club and their space offered to another child.

Similarly, dinner money accounts should be kept up to date. Failure to do so could mean that you are asked to provide a packed lunch until your child's account is back in credit.

#### **Medical Needs**

May we remind you that if your child suffers from Asthma, we need to have two asthma pumps in school at all times. Similarly, if your child has an epi-pen or any other medication that needs to be taken on a regular basis (not antibiotics), please could you send that medication into school as soon as possible, clearly marked with your child's name and any instructions. Please note that we are not able to administer any other medication such as antibiotics

Over the course of the next couple of weeks, your child will be bringing home a copy of the data that we hold on your child in our electronic record. Please check it carefully and return to school with changes clearly marked. You only need to return the sheet if you have made any changes. Thank you.

With an ever growing school, we unfortunately have a growing stock of lost property. Please try to help us reunite items with their owners by ensuring that every item of school uniform is clearly labelled with your child's name. Thanks.
