





# Why is Reading at home important?



Research shows that just 20 minutes a day spent reading with a child helps him/her develop critical reading skills.













About half of illiterate adults live in poverty. They are less likely to find employment than their more literate counterparts.

# Visualise!

### Read

• Read the paragraph

## Image

- Make an image or picture in your mind of the story
- Use your senses.
- · What do you see? hear? feel?

### Describe

• Describe what you see

### Evaluate

• What do you like? Dislike?

Repeat the steps if needed for the next paragraph

# Making Connections

Ask children to build on what they already know to create deeper meaning as they read.

Text to Self (similar events in your life)
Text to Text (books, movies, T.V., etc.)
Text to Life (real world events)

Ask Yourself:

What do I already know about this?

Has anything similar ever happened to me?

How would I feel if this happened to me?

Can I relate to the characters?

Does this story remind me of something?





# Inference

Ask the child to hunt for clues as they read.

Use clues and child's own knowledge to make inferences.

Infer character feelings and traits.
Read between the lines.

# Summarising

Summarising is one of the most challenging skills to teach.
