
# ST. MARY'S COFE PRIMARY SCHOOL NEWSLETTER

### Saturday Achievement School

Last weekend, our Y6 Saturday School sessions started. We were so impressed with the large numbers of children attending.

During these sessions, the children are in small groups of no more that 15. The sessions are carefully structured to focus on areas for development in Maths, Reading and Writing and offer targeted support for all pupils who attend.

These sessions run from 9-12:30. At the end of each term, the children are rewarded with a special treat from the Saturday School Team.

### Saturday Plus

Last weekend, our Year 2 children started Saturday Plus.

Saturday Plus is aimed at enabling children to make increased progress. Children benefit from carefully planned programmes in small groups (1:15 adult to child ratio) aimed specifically at the children's level. In addition to supporting the children in their core learning, they also take part in a range of creative activities and at the end of the Autumn Term we arrange a special treat for the children who have attended! These sessions run from 9:15-2pm

## SCHOOL STREETS UPDATE

At Parent Council this week, our main focus was around our shared vision on championing School Streets. Please keep an eye out for a special edition newsletter detailing how you can support us in becoming part of School Streets and the actions we need to take!

Below you will find a short summary of what School Streets are:

School Streets are an initiative to create safer streets for everyone by reducing traffic congestion and improving local air quality. School Streets involve temporarily closing one or more roads surrounding a school to most vehicles for a short period at the start and end of the school day. Restrictions should have the following benefits for the school community and residents:

- Improved road safety for all road users
- A reduction in anti-social behaviour from inconsiderate parking and dangerous vehicle movements
- Less vehicles on the school run, which will reduce traffic and make it easier for pupils, parents, carers and staff to walk, scoot and cycle to school
- Improved air quality around the school gates due to reduced vehicle idling More information can be found here: www.walthamforest.gov.uk/schoolstreets



#### **COVID-19: Our Joint Responsibilities**

One important part of ensuring the safety and wellbeing of pupils, students, parents and our community is testing for coronavirus. We all have a duty to make sure that the right people have access to a test at the right time.

• You should only book a test if your child has any of these three coronavirus symptoms:

1. a high temperature: any new high temperature where your child feels hot to touch on their chest or back (you do not need to measure the temperature)

2. a new continuous cough: coughing a lot for more than an hour, or three or more coughing episodes in 24 hours

3. a loss of, or change in, sense of smell or taste: a noticeable loss of smell or taste or things smell and taste different to normal

• Your child does not need a test if they have a runny nose, are sneezing or feeling unwell but do not have a temperature, cough or loss of, or change in, sense of smell or taste because these are not normally symptoms of coronavirus.

• If you are unsure about whether to get a test, please check the official list of symptoms on the NHS website, which is reviewed regularly: www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/symptoms/

• Only the person with symptoms should get a test. You do not need to get a test for anyone else in the household unless they also have any of the three symptoms listed above. All members of the household need to self-isolate whilst waiting for the test result.

• If the person with symptoms' test comes back positive, other members of their household should continue self-isolating for 14 days and only get a test if they develop coronavirus symptoms.
