Dear Parents and Carers,

Throughout the week, I have caught sight of rehearsals for the Nativity which will be performed by Reception and year 1. The rehearsals are going well and there is growing excitement for the performance. I am delighted to announce that the Nativity will be performed at Saint Mary's Church in Walthamstow Village. Saint Mary's Church has undergone significant building work in the last 12 months and so we have been unable to visit. As such, we are all especially happy that the Nativity will be performed there this year. A number of other christmas events are being planned - a christmas jumper day, a christmas movie evening and carol singing - and I will write to you about these events shortly.

Last week was anti-bullying week. To mark this, we held an anti-bullying assembly and in PSHE lessons children learned about the harmful effects of bullying; how to deal with bullying and how bullying contravenes our values. This was an important opportunity for children to reflect on our Christian values - in particular caring and respect. Saint Mary's vision is based upon John 15:12 "Love each other as I have loved you" which is something everyone at Saint Mary's embodies and is of course a sentiment completely antithetical to bullying.

<u>Values</u>

Respect

This week we have been reflecting on the theme of forgiveness. We have looked at a passage from Jeremiah Chapter 2 Verse 7: "I brought them into a fertile land, to respect and enjoy its harvest and its other good things. But instead they disrespected the land and defiled the country I had given them".

In Autumn 1, all classes studied creation in their R.E. lessons and thought a lot about whether God would be satisfied with the way humans have treated his creation. It seems pertinent to return to this question now as the whole world reflects on our own impact on the environment and climate change, off the back of Cop27. As Christians, we believe that part of our purpose on earth is to be custodians of God's creations and yet there are numerous examples of how humans continue to pollute and destroy the world. The children have been thinking of ways in which to protect the environment, from making posters to encourage recycling and reusing, to our eco-councillors designing their own manifesto for making our school more sustainable.

Respect is also something we show to our community. During Cop27, it was significant that many countries agreed to support those less well off in shouldering the financial burden of the effects of climate change. When we all work together, perhaps there is a greater chance of reversing some of these effects and returning to God's Creation. In the Bible, God teaches that we should respect Him above everyone else; in the story of Daniel, Daniel puts his faith in God above the respect he owes to the King. He is punished by the King, but ultimately saved by God. This is an example of someone standing up for their beliefs, knowing that in the long run, it is the right thing to do, even if it costs them in the short term. We continue to be inspired by the example of courageous advocates like Daniel, like Nelson Mandela and Greta Thunberg, among others, who stand up for what is right and who respect God and His creations above everything even when it means repercussions for them in their own lifetime.

Healthy Snacks

We would like to remind parents and carers that St Mary's is a Healthy School. Children should not bring chocolate bars, crisps or fizzy drinks as morning snacks, if your child does bring these in, they will be replaced with a piece of fruit and sent home with them at the end of the school day. Please ensure that should you like to provide your child with a snack that it is a healthy option. Nut free cereal bars, yoghurt bars or fruit bars are recommended.

All children are encouraged to drink water regularly – please ensure that your child is bringing in their own water bottles, these can be refilled during the school day.

EYFS - Caring

Together with our church, Reception children will rehearse and sing some of our favourite Christmas Carols. Of course parents and carers get the treat to see them performed in church; however, the children will also perform these carols at the town hall for everyone in our community to enjoy. By sharing the gift of songs, we hope to transform an audience into joyful listeners.

Year 1- Community

Our emergency services are there to keep us safe. Year one will meet real firemen/ women who will tell them how to become a fire worker and what work they do in London. They also learn that women can be become a firewoman and that is a really exciting career choice. By knowing who keeps us safe, we feel protected and reassured.
