Dear Parents and Carers,

I want to begin this edition of the Newsletter with a huge thank you to those of you able to attend our recent Black History event. It was wonderful to see so many of you at the event enjoying the work on display and, of course, sampling Ms Bailey's jerk chicken and goat curry. The children were rightfully proud of their work and I know it meant a lot to them for their parents and carers to see it exhibited in such a creative and engaging way. I look forward to writing to you soon about other exciting events taking place at St. Mary's.

I wrote to you before half-term about St. Mary's 'Courageous Advocacy' speech writing competition. The key stage two competition took place last week and was a tremendous success. The mayor, a member of the clergy and a member of the governors joined us for the competition and had the difficult task of judging it. The children spoke with passion, conviction and courage about topics from chess to animal rights; from speaking up for oneself to homelessness. It was a truly inspiring event and all of the children received a well-earned medal for participation. Florence in year 5 won the competition with a stirring speech about food and food production. Well done, Florence, and to all of those children who took part.

As part of our Young Transformers project we have been encouraging children to apply for 'independence' awards. These awards are given to children who have done something to transform themselves, others or their community outside of school. Jasmin in year 6 won a very special Young Transformers award this week for donating all of her birthday money to Children in Need. This remarkable act of generosity is a testament to her thoughtfulness and kindness and we are terribly proud of her.

This week, it was a great honour and privilege to be recognised for services to faith and belief communities in Greater London by the Faith and Belief Forum. We were invited to attend the FBFs 7th annual awards ceremony for the amazing work our school community has done to support refugees within our community. The work done by all of us - children, teachers, parents and carers at other schools in the Genesis Trust - is something to be proud of. Thank you for your part in it.

Christmas is fast approaching and the sense of excitement and anticipation at St. Mary's is growing fast. Ms Valiquette wrote to you last week about forthcoming events but I wanted to take the opportunity to remind you of the following events. We will have a pantomime in school on Monday 4th December and on Thursday 7th December we will have a Christmas Jumper Day. Friday the 8th will be the final day for donations to our 'Warm Clothing' and 'Toys for Children' drives. Finally, on Tuesday 19th December we will have class party day. If your child is going to be absent due to illness, please leave a message for the office team on the school absence line by calling 020 8521 1066 and dialling 1.




Please ensure this message includes the reason your child is off sick - i.e. sore throat, temperature or stomach bug.

Medication

Worship

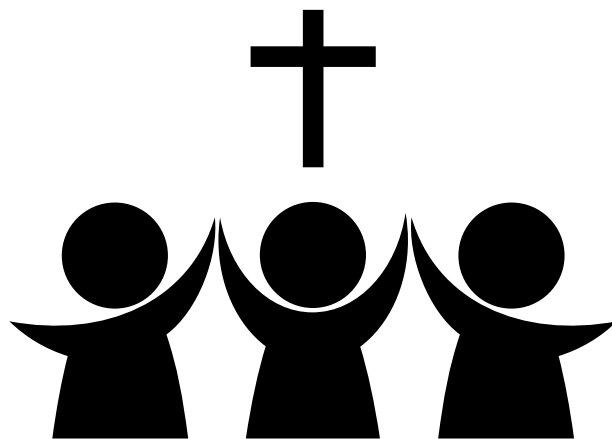
