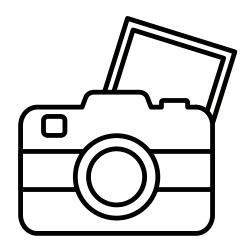
Just as God created the world with purpose and love, we can start this school year with those same values - doing our best, helping one another, and being grateful for all the gifts God has given us.
