It has been a hugely exciting time since the last newsletter: each year group has had its share of exciting learning and experiences. From a trip to a local forest school, to writing poetry, the children at St. Mary's have had a great few weeks.

In preparation for meeting the children's poet Roger Stevens next week, the children in year 1 crafted their own poems. The children have also been busy practising for their Black History Month assembly and have been learning the song "Lovely Day" by Bill Withers so do encourage them to share a rendition with you. Year 2 particularly enjoyed electing the class public servants. Looking ahead, the Year 2 team is excited to explore Ndebele art, inspired by the work of the South African artist Esther Mahlangu. The children will be creating colourful homes in her distinctive style, which they look forward to sharing with you at the Black History Showcase. Year 3 have been learning all about ancient Greece, creating their own painted pots and enjoying the myths and stories of this fascinating civilisation. Year 4 had a great time this week visiting the forest school at St. Saviour's. The children gathered around the fire to roast marshmallows and enjoy the outdoors together. Year 5 have been learning about the Victorians, the hardships of the workhouse and even the protests which led to the introduction of child labour laws. Finally, year 6 have been learning all about the second world war and the great toll it took on civilians. The children have particularly enjoyed the classic novel Goodnight Mr Tom and the writing they have produced based on the story is impressive.

This October, our school is celebrating Black History Month through a rich programme of learning and events. Our assembly series, themed "Standing Firm in Power and Pride," has begun, and we will also join the nationwide Big Live assembly to hear from inspiring Black role models and guest contributors. The assembly will mark the 70th anniversary of Rosa Parks' extraordinary act of bravery that changed history. On Friday 17th October, children are invited to wear a red top and, if possible, bring a small donation in support of the charity Show Racism the Red Card, standing together against racism. Throughout the month, children will enjoy immersive lessons in Art, History, and Music, with some year groups also experiencing a vibrant African Dance workshop.

It was wonderful to see so many of you at St. Mary's this week for our cheese and wine evenings. We hope you enjoyed the events as much as we did and we look forward to hosting similar events soon.

Our whole-school attendance this year is 97.6%. We're so proud of the effort families are making to ensure children are in school every day, ready to learn! Good attendance matters - every day in school is a day of learning, progress, and fun with classmates.
