Important Messages


Medication

Message from Leann

Dear Parents and Carers

You will be aware that our school community takes great pride in the social justice projects run through our Young Transformers programme. We are delighted to share that, thanks to the generosity and determination of our pupils, families and staff, the three schools in our Trust have raised over £20,000 to support people affected by homelessness.

We are proud to have donated these funds to Centrepoint, Depaul, the local Forest Churches Emergency Night Shelter, Barking Churches Unite and other initiatives. The funding has been used to sponsor shelter beds for the winter season, provide bursaries, support emergency helplines, contribute to Nightstop hosts (including a hot meal, a welcome pack of toiletries, new pyjamas, and access to showers and laundry facilities) and offer counselling. Our school communities have also been creating Kindness Kits to support vulnerable people during the winter months.

Through this work, children have deepened their understanding of homelessness and the importance of compassion and community action. We are incredibly proud of these achievements and remain committed to social justice, ensuring everyone has a place of welcome and sanctuary.

In the week before we broke up, the children will take part in four 'Hope Lights Up' lessons, with our 'Ribbons of Welcome' session serving as the first introduction to the programme. During these lessons, we will show the children that Jesus always stood up for the most vulnerable in society, even if this challenged common practices and beliefs. We encourage the children to think critically about the world around them and to respond positively by taking action, showing compassion and fostering understanding. It is remarkable what we have achieved across our three schools, though much work remains in challenging prejudice, inequality and discrimination.

This term, we will deepen our understanding of British Values and explore why they matter in a diverse society. We will also examine concepts such as freedom, democracy and tolerance. As children develop their understanding, we will encourage them to reflect on different viewpoints, ask thoughtful questions and recognise that questions about identity and belonging do not always have simple answers.

Caring



Caring

Y6

The Year 6 pupils will be delving into the United Nations 17 Goals for sustainable development. They will focus in on the goal to end poverty learning about poverty, exploring biases linked to poverty and develop their own thinking into a Ted Talk outline.



Y4

Wisdom

In Year 4, students will collaborate in groups on an engaging oracy project, preparing and delivering their own TED Talks on topics that resonate with them. Leveraging technology and their communication skills, they aim to share their messages with a wide audience. This term, they will focus on researching and developing their chosen topics.


